Directions: Find the line with the number of *family members living in the household, and find your **Gross Income Level. If your Gross Income level is at or below 200% of Poverty Level you qualify for the grant program.

***Family Members** are defined as all people living in your household that are related by blood, marriage, or adoption.

****Gross Income** is defined as the total earnings received in a month by family members living in a house hold. This includes payments received before taxes and other deductions, state disability insurance and temporary workers' compensation payments are considered gross earnings. Child support and alimony paid by a family member and Wage garnishments are not included in the gross earned income total. However you must provide proof of payments made.
